At this infant stage AHEAD Tanzania in collaboration with communities and like-minded partners has successfully;

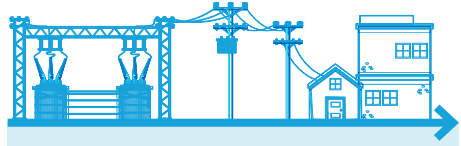
